Points of Pride

- ➤ In 2021-22, Georgia Tech athletics finished No. 68 nationally in the Directors' Cup, college athletics' most widely recognized all-sports rankings. Tech was one of only six institutions ranked among the top 70 in the 2021-22 Directors' Cup standings that fields as few as 17 teams. Prior to finishing No. 68 in 2021-22, No. 44 in 2020-21 and No. 66 in 2018-19, Georgia Tech had not finished in the top 70 in the Directors' Cup standings since 2010-11.
- Fourteen of Georgia Tech's 17 teams were represented in NCAA postseason competition in 2021-22, including all eight women's teams for the first time in school history.
- ➤ Georgia Tech athletics' on-field achievements are coupled with great academic success, highlighted by the Yellow Jackets' most recent NCAA Graduation Success Rate coming in at a school-record 90%. In the NCAA's latest Academic Progress Rate (APR) data, 13 of Tech's 15 sports programs boast multi-year APR scores higher than the national average in their respective sports and 10-of-15 recorded a perfect single-year APR score of 1,000. Georgia Tech student-athletes have also recorded a mean grade point average of 3.0 or higher for eight-straight semesters.



What is a Faculty Athletic Representative?

- ➤ A Faculty Athletic Representative (FAR) is a member of the faculty at an NCAA-member institution and serves as a liaison between an institution and its Athletics Association. The FAR reports to President Cabrera
- In partnership with the Athletics Director, the FAR formulates and recommends institutional positions on NCAA legislation and other matters affecting intercollegiate athletics on the campus
- Key Duties at Georgia Tech:
 - Representing the Institute to the NCAA and ACC;
 - As a member of the GT eligibility certification team, ensuring studentathletes meet all NCAA, conference, and institutional requirements for eligibility
 - Serving as the Vice Chair of the GTAA Board of Trustees, and Vice Chair Alexander-Tharpe Fund board of directors
 - Serving on the GTAA Committee on Academics
 - Interacting with Student Athlete Advisory Board (SAAB)
 - Participating as required in institutional & NCAA investigations of allegations of rules violations.









What is your Faculty Athletic Representative?

- ➤ I represent the interests of the student-athletes and ensure that they are students first and that the competitive athletic experience complements their education.
 - I am a resource outside of the athletic department that our student athletes can come to for help navigating their student experience and ensure that their athletic pursuits augment their scholastic and professional development goals.
 - Towards these goals, I serve as a communication pathway between our faculty and our STUDENTathletes, and those staff that support them, to ensure mutual understanding and respect of our overall mission of excellence at Georgia Tech.
- ➤ I am working on initiatives build bridges between athletics, faculty and staff:
 - Creation of a Faculty and Staff Athletics Advisory Board.
 - Developing new opportunities for faculty and staff engagement in athletics and the student-athlete experience.
 - Visiting faculty meetings with Student Athletes



Jackets Without Borders

In May 2022, Jackets Without Borders, Georgia Tech athletics' award-winning international service program, made its first trip in three years, as 16 student-athletes and four staff members traveled to Villa del Rio, Puerto Rico to continue hurricane rehabilitation efforts following the storms that devastated the island in 2017.

➤ Founded in 2017, the 2022 Jackets Without Borders trip marked JWOB's third trip to Villa del Rio, as the community continues to rebuild from the effects of Hurricanes Irma and Maria in 2017. Prior to the trips to Villa del Rio, the initial Jackets Without Borders project took place in Cartago, Costa Rica in 2017, where Georgia Tech's student-athletes and staff assisted in building a multi-use sports court for a K-12 school.

In 2019, Jackets Without Borders was the recipient of the Atlantic Coast Conference's prestigious Game Changers Award as the ACC's top service initiative of the year.

The 2022 Jackets Without Borders trip was the first to be entirely funded without Georgia Tech athletics department operational funds, as funds for the \$40,000 trip were raised entirely by participating student-athletes, teams and

generous donors.







Compliance

- The compliance office is primarily responsible for executing the comprehensive compliance program in order to appropriately educate constituents, provide interpretations, and prevent violations of applicable NCAA, ACC, Institute, and GTAA rules.
- The office aims to foster a culture of compliance and institutional control that promotes the mission and values of the GTAA. Constituents include all individuals associated with the GTAA – prospective student-athletes, current student-athletes, coaches, GTAA staff, Georgia Tech faculty and staff, and representatives of athletics interests, or boosters.





Eligibility

- > Be an academic qualifier and certified as an amateur with the NCAA Eligibility Center
- > Must always be enrolled as a full-time GT student (i.e. 12 hours)
- Seasons of eligibility*
 - 5 years, 4 seasons
 - Football only May play in 4 games & redshirt
- > Transfer
 - May only transfer one-time as an undergraduate and be eligible to play immediately;
 - Written notification of transfer and completion of the NCAA educational module required prior to going in to the transfer portal;
 - Financial aid may be terminated upon entry to the transfer portal.
- ➤ Graduate/second Baccalaureate student must pass 6 hours each semester








Academic Progress Rate (APR)

- APR is an annual scorecard of academic achievement calculated for all NCAA Division I sports teams. It measures eligibility, graduation and retention each semester or academic term and provides a clear picture of the academic performance for each team in every sport. APR scores are measured on a scale of 1,000 with the threshold for penalties set at 930.
- ▶ In the latest data, 13 of Georgia Tech's 15 sports programs boast a multiyear APR higher than the national average in their respective sports. In all, seven of the Yellow Jackets' 15 sports have APRs at least 10 points higher than the national average baseball (+18), men's track (+17), football (+15), men's tennis (+14), golf (+12), men's basketball (+11) and men's cross country (+10).
- Nine of Georgia Tech's 15 programs have multiyear APRs of 990 or higher, led by golf and men's tennis, who both have perfect multiyear APR scores of 1,000.
- ➤ Ten of Tech's 15 programs recorded a perfect single-year APR for 2020-21: baseball, men's basketball, men's cross country, women's cross country, golf, women's swimming and diving, men's tennis, men's track and field, women's track and field and volleyball. Remarkably, Georgia Tech golf has had a perfect APR score of 1,000 each of the 18 years since the metric was introduced.
- Men's golf has had a perfect APR score of 1,000 each of the 17 years since the metric was introduced. MBA has steadily improved since 2014-2015 from 972 to 995 with 3 consecutive multiyear scores in the 990's. MBB has reached record high of 979. MFB is above the national average

NCAA Graduation Success Rate


- NCAA Graduation Success Rate (GSR) measures the success of an athletics department in graduating its student- athletes within a six-year period. Georgia Tech's GSR has steadily grown since 2012 (2006-2007 cohort) from **76% to 91%**.
- GSR also includes transfer students and mid-year enrollees in the sample.
- Student-athletes who leave an institution while in good academic standing before exhausting athletics eligibility are removed from the cohort of their initial institution.
- The GSR provides a more complete and accurate look at actual student-athlete success by taking into account the full variety of participants in Division I athletics and tracking their academic outcomes.
